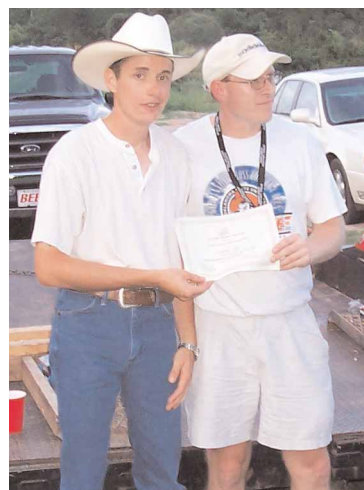


2004 OKLAHOMA SWCS SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENT
